

## **UI and Responsive Testing**

## Background

This checklist will help you verify that the UI is responsive and looks correct in all browsers.

## Browsers and device OS's to check

Note that the below list includes mobile devices.

- Firefox (Desktop, Android, iOS)
- Chrome (Desktop, Android, iOS)
- Safari (Desktop, iOS)
- IE
- Edge

In addition to testing all browsers, as many mobile devices as possible should be tested to ensure compatibility.

At a minimum, the following breakpoints should be verified to ensure the UI remains intact. This can be done by manually re-sizing a browser, or using responsive developer tools. In Chrome, this can be accessed by opening dev tools and then pressing "Ctrl+M". Firefox Developer Edition has a similar feature. Also note that when dev tools are open, Chrome will have a small overlay in the corner that tells you how large the window is when you are resizing it. Test at the following resolutions:

- 1920 x 1080 (full-screen desktop)
- 1600 x 900
- 1440 x 900 & 1440 x 1024
- 1366 x 768
- 1280 x 1024 & 1280 x 800
- 1024px x 768
- 768px x 1024
- 320 x 480 (small phone portrait)
